

#### Dear international students

Once a year, students at Chemnitz University elect their student representatives. This booklet will give you all the necessary details about the candidates, election procedure and the student representative candidates.

You probably have already met us during the orientation week, at some other event organised by us or simply came by our office to ask questions regarding your studies. However, our main task as the student representatives of computer science students is to communicate with professors and other university staff on your behalf.

The student representatives consists of up to 15 members which are elected every year. This year, there are 17 candidates nominated for the next term, which will start in April 2026 and holds for the following 12 months. The election for that legislative term will take place 8th - 10th December. You should have received a polling notice ("Wahlbenachrichtigung") via e-mail. The election stations are located in the following rooms:


Please bring your **student ID card** for identification and verification. You have three votes which can be accumulated on one candidate or distributed among multiple candidates.

#### What is the purpose of the student representatives?

The main task of the student representatives (FSR) is to support the computer science students' interests at the faculty and at the whole university. If you have ideas on how to improve your course of study or you have had problems with your examinations you can ask your student representatives for help.




Hey everyone! I'm Joel, even though I'm still listed with my old name as a voting option (see the email). But that doesn't change anything about my qualities :D







# **Committees**

# Student representatives (FSR)

The student representatives are the student representation on faculty level. They are responsible for cultural events, for the promotion of political education and of course above all to help with your studies. Furthermore they represent the students' interests towards the faculty and the university and are also point of contact for student problems. They advise students who are not familiar with their study regulations, intervene when injustice occurs somewhere and point out possibilities for improvement in the course of studies.

# Student Council (StuRa)

The FSR:IF elects up to 4 students to the student council ("StuRa"). This is the representation the student body of the entire university. They are responsible for various cultural activities such as readings and concerts.

Furthermore student projects, such as the game night, and university sports get financially supported. The student clubs PEB, FPM and the film club "mittendrin" – as well as the Chemnitz student network – are under their financial sovereignty. With the VMS and the railroad, they pursue regular negotiations for the semester ticket. Also they made it possible to get the upgrade to the Deutschlandticket. If it is necessary, they speak with the university management or start – often in cooperation with the other Saxon student councils – higher education policy actions.

# **Faculty Council**

The Faculty Council is the highest body of the faculty. It advises and decides about vocations, courses of study, orders and all other things that faculty. Up to two members of it are students.

# Study commissions

Most study commissions – there is a study commission for each study program – are currently made up of three students and three teachers occupied. In recent years they have worked on the study and examination regulations for the new Bachelor and Master programs. Otherwise she is responsible for the continuous evaluation of the courses and for the annual teaching report. It is also intended to make proposals for reforming the Making study regulations when problems are identified somewhere.




