## APPLICATION

### Exchange/Visiting student tuition fees

- ♦ *Exchange Students* from Partner Universities will not be charged any tuition fees.
- ♦ *Visiting Students* will be charged the tuition fee of INU for international students.

### Application Procedure

- ♦ Contact the international office of your home university.
- ♦ The international office of your home university submits an [online nomination](#).
- ♦ Submit the required application documents to the international office of your home university.
- ♦ The international office of your home university screens the application documents and interviews you to see if you are qualified.
- ♦ The international office of your home university sends your application documents to INU by the application deadline.
- ♦ INU screens the application documents and issues a certificate of admission.
- ♦ INU sends the certificate of admission and other materials to the international office of your home university.

## ACADEMIC

### Courses

Information about courses **changes every semester**, so please make sure to **frequently check** our website: The Course List taught in English will be confirmed in early February / August for next semester. ### Korean Language Courses

- ♦ We offer free Korean language courses to exchange students(only Undergraduate/ Credits given).
  - ♦ You don't have to register for the 'Korean language courses' during the official course registration period. (If you have very basic Korean Language Skill, please register the Level 1.)
- The Korean level test will be held after the beginning of the semester. After the Korean Level Test, you need to register a class depends on your level. . [Link](#)

### Credit Load

All exchange students have to take at least one class. Undergraduate students are allowed to take up to 18 credits per semester. Graduate students are allowed to take up to 9 credits per semester. And most classes are 3 hours per week, which means three credits per class. (1 credit = 15 class hours)

Official Transcript will be sent to your home university( International office), in July / January.

## Visa information

- ♦ Exchange students and Visiting students studying in Korea should hold an **Exchange student visa (D-2-6)** and **Visiting student visa(D-2-8)** before arrival, which can be applied for and obtained at the nearest Korean Embassy or Consulate in your country. [Link](#)
- ♦ When applying, students are required to submit the “**Certificate of Admission**”, which will be officially issued by Incheon National University.
- ♦ Please consult your local Korean Embassy regarding other required documents for your visa application.

## Residency Card Registration

- ♦ You will receive more information about the process at the **International Students Orientation**.
- ♦ **The International office will accompany you** to Immigration office for a Residency Card.
- ♦ Within 90 days of your arrival in Korea, you **must** go to the Immigration Office to register and get a Certificate of Residency Card, regardless of your visa type.  
(After arriving in Korea, you must not leave Korea before a Residency Card is issued.)

## Health Insurance

**International Students are subject to the mandatory subscription to the Korean National Health Insurance. All international students will be automatically enrolled in the National Health Insurance.**  
(Average Monthly Insurance Fee (for 2023): Approx. 65,000 KRW ~ 75,000 KRW.)

Those who enter Korea for the first time will be enrolled from the date of alien registration. Before then, all medical costs should be covered by your own international health insurance. ## Medical Diagnosis

- ♦ To check in the **on-campus dormitory**, students need to have a Tuberculosis test and submit the Tuberculosis test result (in English) to International Office before your departure. The test should be taken within 2 months prior to the check-in date. (Tuberculosis test is not mandatory for off-campus residents)

**Required test : Tuberculosis ( Only X-ray with doctor’s note)**



## CAMPUS LIFE

### Dormitory (type and fees) : On-campus / Off-Campus

- INU **does not allow** students to stay in another place individually for safety management. Please select the On-campus or Off-campus dormitory.

#### 1) On-campus dormitory

- Meals are not included
- Utility fees and facility deposit are included
- Blankets and pillows are not equipped in a room so you should be purchased individually.
- Students must submit the **tuberculosis test result** on move-in day. Without the document, you are not allowed to check-in.

**Cost of living** : Average of cost of living (without accommodation) : around 600,000 KRW / Month

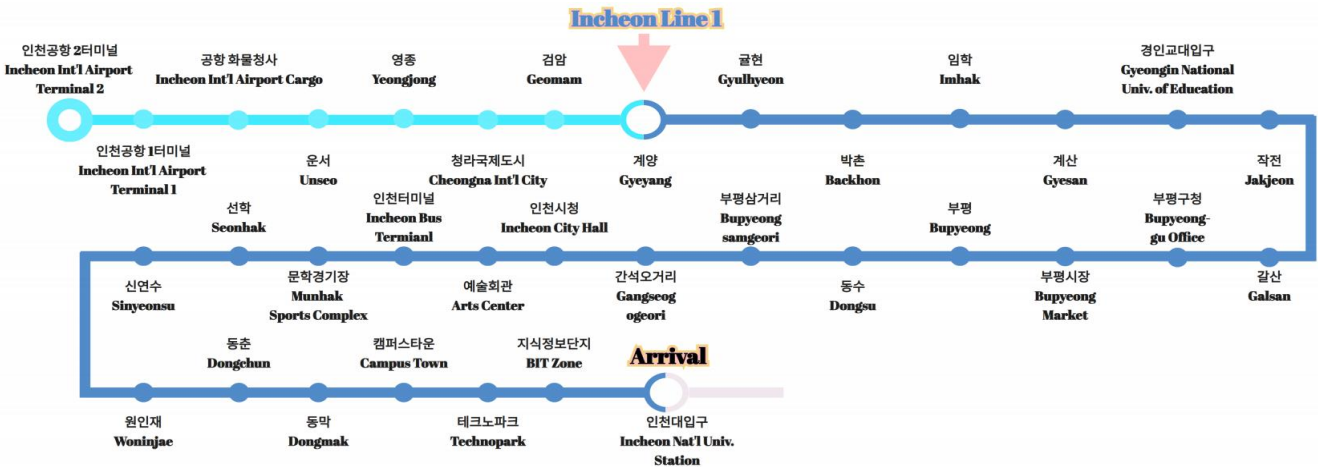
Check out the list below for a rough idea of what you can expect to pay on average

- 1) Meal on campus : around 6,000 KRW
- 2) Meal in the restaurant : around 10,000 KRW
- 3) National Health insurance : around 75,000 KRW / month
- 4) Transportation (Bus or Metro): 1,200KRW ~ 1,700 KRW / one way

*It's about 20~30mintues walk from a station to INU campus. Or at the Exit No.3 of "Incheon National University" Station, take Bus (with Bus 8, 16,41 / Fare : 1,300 KRW) or Taxi (Fare: Approx.5,000 KRW).*
