APPLICATION

Exchange/Visiting student tuition fees

- ♦ **Exchange Students** from Partner Universities(Currently enrolled) will not be charged any tuition fees.
- ♦ **Visiting Students** from Universities(Currently enrolled) will be charged the tuition fee of INU international students.

Nomination Procedure

The international office of your home university :

- Obtain the User ID and Password for each university.
Please submit [the Form \(Click\)](#) or send an email (inbound@inu.ac.kr) to request the ID and Password for the Online Nomination Link.
→ The International Office of INU will send the University's ID and PASSWORD to the International Office of your home university after submitting [the Form \(Click\)](#)
- Access the [Online Nomination LINK](#) and complete the Nomination application for each student.

Application Procedure

- Nominated students
Submit the required application documents (Listed below) through the [Online Application LINK](#) during the application period.
Please prepare the application documents in advance, just in case obtaining certain documents takes time. This will ensure that the process goes smoothly and avoids any last-minute delays.
- INU screens the application documents and issues a certificate of admission.
- Students can download the certificate of admission and other materials in the [Online Application LINK](#) to apply for a visa.

Acceptance Package, including Letter of Acceptance, Certificate of Admission, etc, can be downloaded from the "Online Application Website" from mid-June or mid-December.

ACADEMIC & VISA

Courses

Information about courses changes every semester, so please check our website regularly.

Major students have the first opportunity to register for their major courses during the Course Registration Period. The English-taught courses List will be confirmed for next semester in early February / August. Please refer to the course list from the previous corresponding semester. [2025 course list : Link](#)

All students register for courses through the online course registration system at the same time, so it may be competitive to get a spot in some courses. We recommend that students discuss with the Coordinator at their home university to prepare several options in advance for registration.

Korean Language Courses

- ♦ We offer free Korean language courses to exchange students(only Undergraduate/ Credits given).
- ♦ The Korean-level test must be taken before the semester.

Credit Load

All exchange students have to take at least one class. Undergraduate students are allowed to take up to 18 credits per semester. Students can take courses across all majors, with the exception of courses that are restricted to exchange students. Graduate students are allowed to take up to 9 credits per semester and not allowed to take Undergraduate courses. Most classes are 3 hours per week, which means three credits per class.

(1 credit = 15 class hours)

Official Transcripts will be sent to the student and home university(International office) in July / January.

Visa information

- ♦ Exchange and Visiting students studying in Korea should hold an **Exchange student visa (D-2-6) or a Visiting student visa(D-2-8)** before arrival, which can be applied for and obtained at your country's nearest Korean Embassy or Consulate. [Link](#)
- ♦ When applying, students must submit the “**Certificate of Admission**”, which will be officially issued by Incheon National University.
- ♦ Please consult your local Korean Embassy regarding other required documents for your visa application.
- ♦ **Please note that student visas are single-entry.** If a student enters Korea on a single-entry visa and leaves the country before receiving their Residence Card (RC), **the visa will be immediately cancelled** and become invalid.
As a result, the student will not be able to re-enter Korea with the same visa. They will need to obtain a new Certificate of Admission and apply for a new visa, which may involve significant time and additional costs, including potential fines.
- ♦ **The International office will guide you** on how to apply for your Residency Card during the International Students Orientation.
- ♦ Within 90 days of your arrival in Korea, you must go to the Immigration Office to register and get a Certificate of Residency Card, regardless of your visa type.
(After arriving in Korea, you must not leave Korea before a Residency Card is issued.)

Health Insurance

1) All international students will be automatically enrolled in the National Health Insurance. (Average Monthly Insurance Fee (for 2025): Approx. 75,000 KRW.) and from the date of the alien registration card. Before that, your international health insurance should cover all medical costs. Students have to subscribe in advance to personal insurance valid for 2 to 3 months from the moment of arrival to Korea.

2) **Purchasing Private International Insurance is Mandatory** because of the gap in NHIS's effect.

This private insurance covers international students' accidents and sicknesses until the National Health Insurance(NHIS) takes effect, which is much broader than NHIS.(Ex. in case of an Operation, etc.) You can purchase International Insurance from your home country, OR Insurance from a Korean private company; we will provide information. The students will be responsible for addressing their travel abroad needs. Please check the details on our website, [Health Insurance](#).

- Meals are not included
- Utility fees and facility deposit are included
- Blankets and pillows are not provided in a room, so you should purchase them individually.
- Students must submit the **Tuberculosis test result** (Only an X-ray with a doctor's note, only two months before the check-in date is valid.) **and a Certificate of Measles Vaccination** (at least once) on move-in day. Without the document, you are not allowed to check in. The TB test should be taken within two months before the check-in date.
- Extensions are possible during vacations; the International Office will announce detailed information before the semester ends. The details are subject to change, and we will inform you as soon as we have. For more information, please refer to the [link](#)
- Due to the capacity of the on-campus dormitory, depending on the number of exchange students, there will also be an option for off-campus housing.

Off-Campus: If you wish to live off-campus, you need to get permission from your home university.

You may stay at the Off-Campus Residence that we informed you about (in January/July), or you can choose to find your own accommodation.

Estimate monthly cost of living (without accommodation): Bare minimum KRW 600,000 (approx.. USD 450).

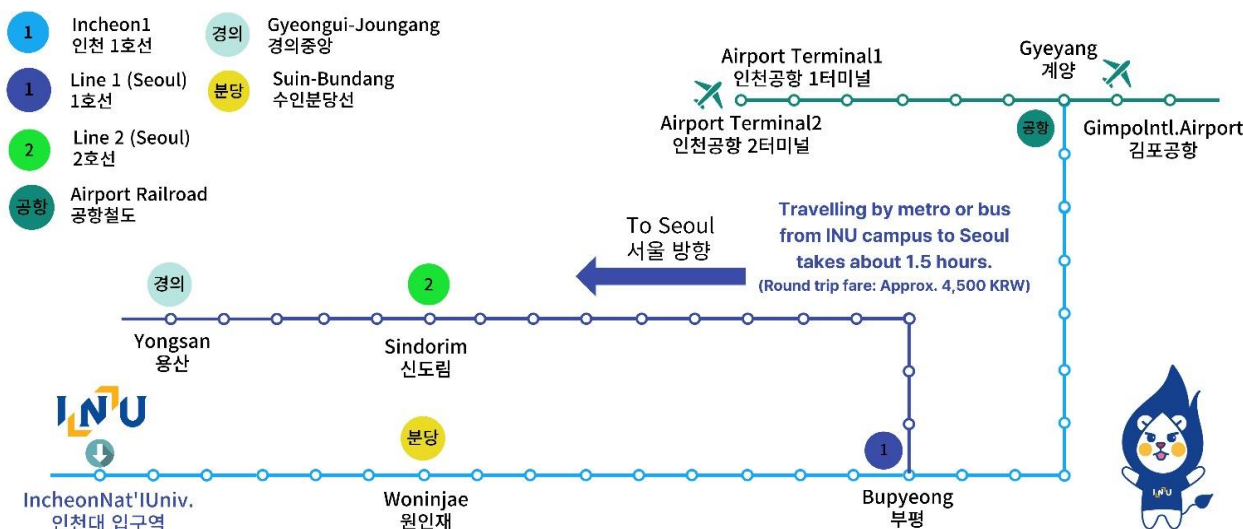
Check out the list below for a rough idea of what you can expect to pay on average

- 1) Meal on campus: around KRW 6,000
- 2) Meal in the restaurant: around KRW 10,000
- 3) National Health insurance: around KRW 75,000 / month
- 4) Transportation (Bus or Metro): KRW 1,200 ~ KRW 1,700 / one-way

Location : (Songdo Campus) 119 AcademyRo, Yeonsu-Gu, Incheon, Republic of Korea (22012)

- Metro Station: Incheon Metro Line 1. "Incheon National University" Station.

It's about a 20- 30-minute walk from a station to the INU campus. Or at Exit No.3 of "Incheon National University" Station, take a Bus (with Bus 8, 16, 41 / Fare: 1,300 KRW) or a Taxi (Fare: Approx. 5,000 KRW).



Buddy Program

- Buddy students may help you settle down at the Incheon National University at the beginning of the semester. The INU International office will assign your buddy(INU student), and your buddy may contact you before you arrive in Korea. During your stay at INU, buddies can also offer linguistic support, cultural guidance, and useful information about life in Korea.
