However, we recommend that students have no less than an intermediate level of Italian to make the most of their stay and make daily life in Rome easier and more enjoyable.

An intermediate level of English is accepted instead of Italian proficiency in the following cases:

- students who wish to attend classes from degree programmes fully or partially taught in English (<http://corsidilaurea.uniroma1.it/en>)
- students coming for their final thesis project or for training work, whose tutor accepts English as working language.
