



What are the biggest differences between China and Europe ? (e.g. people, culture)

- Chinese are very traditional and more respectful especially towards old people
- ► Food, culture, values
- Introverts
- ▶ The way of thinking is completely different.
- ► "They have some of their oldest cultures, arts still present. Europe has become more modernized and forgoten about her past."



Do you know any stereotypes about China and do you think they are true or not?

- ▶ 17 "eat" over half of them are talking about eating rice, the rest are about eating dogs, cat, and everything.
- ▶ 7 people talk Chinese people being shy, introvert and polite. One specific answer, "they're super polite…won't tell you directly if something is offending them…"
- ▶ 7 people mention Chinese people are hard workers.
- ▶ 3 people talk about if Chinese people all look the same, and they all think that's false.

Interesting responses that might raise discussion

- ► Chinese parents are tiger parents?
- "They wear a mask to protect them from air pollution. They live in dirty houses." "They cut the arms for stealing."
- There are mentions about China's social and environmental problems, such as cheap labor, child policy (now two-child policy), etc.



What do you think of "Made in China"?

- The result shows a mixed European attitude towards "Made in China".
- Over half of the responses associate the products "made in China" with "cheap" and "bad quality".
- ▶ 5 people specifically mention that the electronic products from China are of good quality, indicating that China's electronic business may be prospering and starting to earn a reputation in Europe.

Interesting responses that might raise discussion

- There are mentions about child labor, bad working conditions, etc.
- Some people mention that even they believe "Made in China" means bad quality, they cannot escape them because they are everywhere.

Do you perceive the Chinese as more hardworking than the Europeans? Why?




Figure 3: Europeans' perceptions about the work attitude of Chinese (n=57)






Figure 4: Europeans' responses about Euro-China friendship (n=57)
