<b>Module Name</b>	Chinesisch I (Level A1/1)
<b>Contact Person</b>	Director of the language centre (Zentrum für Fremdsprachen)
<b>Content and Goals of the Qualification</b>	<p><u>Content:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Imparting basic knowledge of the Chinese language (lexis, grammar, phonetics);</li> <li>- Introduction and practice of standard situations such as meeting and introducing people, weather, time and shopping</li> <li>- Learning first grammatical structures</li> <li>- Phonetics exercises</li> </ul> <p>The training is oriented to the B1 language level in the CEF (Common European Framework).</p> <p><u>Goals:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Comprehension of familiar expressions and simple sentences in every-day life situations</li> <li>- Communication of simple expressions and sentences</li> <li>- Answering simple questions referring to personal details as well as articles for every-day use</li> </ul> <p>Completion of this module corresponds to Part 1 of the A1 language level in the CEF (Common European Framework).</p>
<b>Forms of Teaching</b>	<p>The form of teaching involves practical exercises (German: "Übung"= Ü).</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Ü: Kurs 1 (4 teaching hours)</li> </ul>
<b>Prerequisites for Participation</b>	The languages used in class are German and Chinese. A sufficient level of German is required for participation in this course.
<b>Applicability of the Module</b>	Suitable for all courses of studies
<b>Prerequisites for Granting Credit Points</b>	Successful passing of the module test is the prerequisite for granting credit points.
<b>Module Test</b>	<p>A module test consists of a test in which the following is accredited:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• a 90-minute written test for Kurs 1 and a 5-minute oral test (speaking)</li> </ul> <p>The student performance is granted credits if the mark of at least "sufficient" is reached.</p>
<b>Credit Points and Grades/Marks</b>	<b>4 credit points</b> are granted for the module. The evaluation of the test performance and the mark follow the guidelines set in §10 of the testing guidelines (Prüfungsordnung).
<b>Frequency of the Offer</b>	The module is offered every semester.
<b>Amount of Work</b>	The expected amount of time for a student to complete this module is 120 hours of work (60 hours in class and 60 hours of self-study).
<b>Length of the Module</b>	The module normally takes one semester to complete.
