Content and Goals of the Qualification	<p><u>Content</u>: Expanding language knowledge and skills with reference to study-related and career-related topics and situations, imparting knowledge concerning significant differences between oral and written communication (text types, appropriate registers), writing documents for applications;</p> <p>The training is oriented to the language of level of B2 in the CEF (Common European Framework) and involves components of ESP (English for Specific Purposes).</p> <p><u>Goals</u>: Proficiency in dealing with typical every-day academic situations (introducing persons and tasks, naming and describing academic structures, etc.) and further development of strategies for listening and reading;</p> <p>Completion of the module corresponds to the language level of B2 of the CEF (Common European Framework) with an ESP (English-for-Specific-Purposes) orientation.</p>
Forms of Teaching	<p>The form of teaching involves practical exercises (German: "Übung"= Ü).</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ü: Kurs 1: English in study-related standard situations (4 teaching hours)
Prerequisites for Participation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Prior knowledge of English generally and often corresponding to high-school leaving level • Placement test (qualified recommendation)
Applicability of the Module	Suitable for all courses of studies
Prerequisites for Granting Credit Points	Successful passing of the module test is the prerequisite for the granting of credit points.
Module Test	<p>A module test consists of a test in which the following is accredited:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • a 120-minute test for course Kurs 1 <p>The student performance is granted credits if the mark of at least "sufficient" is reached.</p>
Credit Points and Grades/Marks	4 credit points are granted for the module. The evaluation of the test performance and the mark follow the guidelines set in §10 of the testing guidelines (Prüfungsordnung).
Frequency of the Offer	The module is offered every semester.
Amount of Work	The module consists of a total amount of work on the part of the student of 120 hours of work (60 hours in class and 60 hours of self-study).
Length of the Module	The module normally takes one semester to complete.
