Content and Goals of the Qualification	<p><u>Content:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Sounds, stress patterns, phonetic characteristics of the Polish language - Imparting basic knowledge of the Polish language (lexis, grammar, syntax) and of several national and cultural aspects - Introducing and practising vocabulary referring to simple topics such as family, shopping, place of residence / accommodation, free-time activities, eating habits - Grammatical structures including yes-no questions, personal and possessive pronouns, three groups of conjugation, forms of the present tense, adjective endings, nouns and adjectives in the nominative, genitive and accusative, preposition "z" <p>The training is oriented to the A1 language level in the CEF (Common European Framework).</p> <p><u>Goals:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Comprehension and use of familiar every-day expressions and simple sentences - Answering simple questions about personal details, family and free-time activities <p>Completion of the module corresponds to the A1 language level in the CEF (Common European Framework).</p>
Forms of Teaching	<p>The form of teaching involves practical exercises (German: "Übung"= Ü).</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ü: Kurs 1 (4 teaching hours)
Prerequisites for Participation	The languages used in class are German and Polish. A sufficient level of German is required for participation in this course.
Applicability of the Module	Suitable for all courses of studies
Prerequisites for Granting Credit Points	Successful passing of the module test is the prerequisite for granting credit points.
Module Test	<p>A module test consists of a test in which the following is accredited:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • a 90-minute written test for Kurs 1 (Exam number: 92001) <p>The student performance is granted credits if the mark of at least "sufficient" is reached.</p>
Credit Points and Grades/Marks	4 credit points are granted for the module. The evaluation of the test performance and the mark follow the guidelines set in §10 of the testing guidelines (Prüfungsordnung).
Frequency of the Offer	The module is offered every semester.
Amount of Work	The expected amount of time for a student to complete this module is 120 hours of work (60 hours in class and 60 hours of self-study).
