<b>Content and Goals of the Qualification</b>	<p><u>Content:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Expanding and consolidating lexical and grammatical knowledge</li> <li>- Imparting knowledge of cultural and national aspects</li> <li>- Vocabulary focus: technology and media, clothes, stages of life and relationships</li> <li>- Grammatical structures: imperative, subordinate clauses,</li> <li>- Communication structures: coping with codified situations, giving instructions and orders, giving advice and recommendations, talking about future activities, talking about the past</li> </ul> <p>The training is oriented to the A2/B1 language level in the CEF (Common European Framework).</p> <p><u>Goals:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Comprehension of main points referring to familiar topics including work, university, free-time activities in oral and written contexts</li> <li>- Communication referring to simple and familiar topics and personal areas of interest</li> <li>- Sharing experiences and giving reasons for plans and opinions in a concise way</li> </ul> <p>Completion of the module corresponds to the A2/B1 language level in the CEF (Common European Framework).</p>
<b>Forms of Teaching</b>	<p>The form of teaching involves practical exercises (German: "Übung"= Ü).</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Ü: Kurs 3 (4 teaching hours)</li> </ul>
<b>Prerequisites for Participation</b>	<p>Course 2 Certificate or Placement Test (qualified recommendation)</p> <p>The languages used in class are German and Czech. A sufficient level of German is required for participation in this course.</p>
<b>Applicability of the Module</b>	Suitable for all courses of studies
<b>Prerequisites for Granting Credit Points</b>	Successful passing of the module test is the prerequisite for granting credit points.
<b>Module Test</b>	<p>A module test consists of a test in which the following is accredited:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• a 90-minute written test for Kurs 3 (Exam number: 92103)</li> </ul> <p>The student performance is granted credits if the mark of at least "sufficient" is reached.</p>
<b>Credit Points and Grades / Marks</b>	<b>4 credit points</b> are granted for the module. The evaluation of the test performance and the mark follow the guidelines set in §10 of the testing guidelines (Prüfungsordnung)
