

Information for ERASMUS students

ERASMUS students should contact the instructor of the language course chosen to be clear about the following issues:

1. When does the written exam take place? The date can be after the end of the lecture period, i.e. in the examination period lasting three weeks. Can you take the exam or will you have left Chemnitz again before this date?
2. The content and the type of tasks to be dealt with in the written exam. Some exam papers in English may include tasks based on German prompts to be translated or used for a follow-up task. How good is your German? Do you think you can cope with those kinds of tasks?
3. Are you clear about the name of the course and the credit points that can be earned? The number of credit points may vary between courses of different language programmes. If you decide on one course but then change it again, please check how many credit points the new course offers.
4. Please make sure that you check your TUC e-mail account frequently so that the instructor can reach you and inform you about any changes.
