Admission Procedure

IMPORTANT NOTE

Chemnitz University of Technology does not cooperate with commercial agencies in Germany and abroad that place applicants at Chemnitz University of Technology. Information about the application process at our university can be found below.

The following applicants have to apply via uni-assist e.V.:

- Foreign applicants without German high school diploma (applicants with foreign education background, but not for applicants as an exchange student/ Erasmus)
- Foreign applicants with a foreign Bachelor's or Master's degree (not for applicants as an exchange student/ Erasmus)
- Foreign applicants with completed entrance examination test (FSP) from a Studienkolleg in Germany without former admission letter from Chemnitz University of Technology



The following applicants does NOT need to apply via uni-assist, they can use the online application from the Chemnitz University of Technology homepage:

- Applicants of German nationality with foreign high school diploma or foreign university degree
- Applicants with completed entrance examination test (FSP) from Studienkolleg Sachsen in Germany with former admission letter from Chemnitz University of Technology
- Applicants with a European Baccalaureate (decision KMK from 14.06.2018)
- · Applicants with a German university degree
- Applicants who finished the preparatory German language course at Chemnitz University
 of Technology with DSH II and former preparatory course admission letter from our
 university
- Applicants for an exchange programme or outside such a programme (exchange student/ Erasmus)
- Applicants for study course change within the university
- · Applicants for doctoral degree programme

Admission Procedure

Information on the Dialogue-Oriented Service Procedure (DoSV) at Hochschulstart: For the following degree programmes (1st semester) at first you have to apply via the dialogue-oriented service procedure (DoSV) on Hochschulstart.de:

- · State Examination for Education Studies
- · Bachelor Media Communication
- · Bachelor Psychology

Register first at Hochschulstart.de. You will get a BID and a BAN number. You will need this BID and BAN number to apply via the uni-assist application portal. For detailed information about DoSV, please visit the homepage of https://hochschulstart.de.

Application documents that must be submitted to uni-assist

- proof of high school diploma certificate including transcripts in original language, with copy of translation into German or English language
- proof of successfully completed university entrance examination (not for all countries)
- if available, other proofs of successfully completed university studies at the home country (duration of studies, transcripts, acquired degrees), with original attested copies of translations in German or English language
- original APS-certificate or digital verifiable document (only for Chinese, Vietnamese or Indian applicants)
- proof of sport ability test (only if you apply for the Bachelor's degree in Prevention, Rehabilitation and Fitness Sport)
- proof of German language proof if your native language is not German (Please note the exceptions under " Proof of German Proficiency English taught programmes")
- · you can also apply with your provisional certificate or last year transcript

An application via uni-assist is possible for the summer semester from 1st October and for the winter semester from 1st April. You can apply for a maximum of two desired study courses

If all requirements and documents were checked, uni-assist will forward your documents to the university. All applicants who can prove that they have a university entrance qualification (HZB) receive a test report from uni-assist. This documents the determined HZB as well as the converted HZB grade. With the start of processing at the university you will receive an email about the further information of the procedure of your application. In case that the formal requirements are not fulfilled, you will receive a respective message from uni-assist. Please note that uni-assist does not send back any application documents submitted.

Admission Procedure

TestAS is a central, standardised ability assessment for studies. Please note that Chemnitz University of Technology does not issue TestAS-certificates. You may take TestAS-examinations at the following assessment centers.

Application deadlines



summer semester: January 15th winter semester: July 15th

Uni-assist need to receive all application documents until the deadline. Please try to start your application at uni-assist as early as possible so that you can be informed at short notice if your documents are complete. Subsequent documents must be submitted by 15th January (summer semester) / 15th July (winter semester), otherwise the application will be rejected.

Assessment Test ("Feststellungsprüfung")

In the case that your foreign high school diploma is not equivalent to the German high school diploma you have to complete a Studienkolleg in Germany ("Feststellungsprüfung-FSP") before beginning university studies. In a Studienkolleg you will be prepared for studying at a German university. The preparatory year ends with the FSP, which, in combination with your foreign school diploma, entitles you to study in Germany.

The preparatory course and the assessment test are not administered by Chemnitz University of Technology, but by Studienkolleg Sachsen in Leipzig. Students who want to get an admission to Studienkolleg need to show an original certified copy of the German language certificate of status B1 (e.g. DSH I, TestDaF 3/3/3/3, Goethe Institut B1 etc.). For admission to Studienkolleg we also accept language proofs of private institutions.

German taught degree programmes

Proof of German Proficiency is required for students applying for German taught programmes. As proof of German proficiency for direct admission, the following certificates are accepted:

- TestDaf: level 4 in all 4 examinations parts
- telc C1 Hochschule
- Goethe Institute ZOP
- Goethe Institute KDS
- · Goethe Institute GDS
- DSD II
- Goethe-Institute C2
- German language examination of the Sprachen- und Dolmetscher-Institut München
- · German language proof of Diplome du Baccalauréat
- US-Advanced Placement-test (AP-examination) in German language (KMK vom 10./11.09.1992)
- · Leaving certificate of the advanced level of high school from Belgium
- high school certificate of the Grand Duchy Luxemburg
- Maturity Diploma of schools with German as language of instruction in the Autonomous province of Bozen-South Tyrol (Italy)
- Leaving certificate of the international section for German language at Liceo Gimnasiale "Luigi Galvani" in Bologna
- Leaving certificate of German-Irish bilingual high school (Bilingual Leaving Certificate) at the Deutsche Schule Dublin, St. Kilian's
- Leaving certificate of the bilingual departments at Liceo Ginnasio Statale "Romagnosi" in Parma and at Liceo Classico Statale Socrate in Bar

German language proofs from private institutions will ${f not}$ be accepted.

Proof of Language Proficiency

Preparatory German Language Course

For applicants who cannot submit any of the above mentioned German language proofs, Chemnitz University of Technology offers a preparatory German language course.

For this course you need to show one of the following German language proofs:

- · B2 from Goethe-Institute
- ösd B2
- telc B2
- DSHI
- · TestDaF-level 3 at all 4 examination parts

Attendance certificates will **not** be accepted.

This course lasts one or two semester and will qualify to complete the DSH-examination. You will receive the application form for this course together with your admission letter.

This course costs 1.500 € per semester.

Language skills

English taught degree programmes

Applicants applying for a degree programme offered in English language need to show a proof of German language proof at minimum level A1 at the time of application. Until the end of their third study term at Chemnitz University of Technology, they have to submit a German language proof at level A2. German language courses at level A2 will be offered at our university. Language certificates for German language proof at level A1 are only accepted from the Goethe-Institut, telc examination centres or ÖSD.

German language attendance certificates will **not** be accepted.

This regulation is valid for the following courses:

- Master Advanced Manufacturing
- Master Design and Test for Integrated Circuits
- Master Embedded Systems

- Master English Studies
- Master Information and Communication Systems
- Master Micro and Nano Systems

For the following degree programmes, the applicants do **not need to show a proof of German language skills** at the time of application:

- Master Advanced and Computational Mathematics
- Master Advanced Functional Materials
- · Master Automotive Software Engineering
- · Master Web Engineering

Proof of English language skills for English-taught study courses

Please inform yourself in advance at the visa issuing office of the German embassy to find out about the visa requirements and which documents you need to bring with you to apply for a visa, especially language certificates. Applicants for courses taught in English must provide evidence of English language skills. Applicants from countries with English as official /educational or native language are not required to submit a proof of English language proficiency within their application.

For degree programmes taught in English, with the exception of the Master's degree programme in English Studies, English language proficiency at level B2 of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) must be proven by one of the following language certificates:

- · TOEFL PBT: min. 543 points
- TOEFL ITP Level 1: min. 543 points
- Cambridge Preliminary English Test + Result Distinction (PET)
- · Cambridge First Certificate in English: Grade B or C (FCE)
- Cambridge English: Business Vantage (BEC Vantage), Legal (ILEC), Financial (ICFE)
- Cambridge IGCSE: 1st or 2nd Language on average B2
- · Pearson PTE Academic: min. 59 points
- TOEIC: Listening and Reading Test min. 785 points, Speaking Test min. 160 points, Writing Test min. 150 points
- telc B2
- UNIcert II
- · Study in English studies
- · completed degree with English as the language of instruction
- proof of professional qualification as interpreter/ translator

Applicants for the Master's degree **Advanced** and **Computational Mathematics**, who can prove English skills with comparable suitable documents, are subject to an individual assessment.

Applicants for the Master's degree **English Studies** need to submit English language skills at level C1 of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR). This must be proven by one of the following language certificates:

- IELTS from 7.0
- · TOEFL iBT (Internet Based Test): min. 95 points
- · TOEFL PBT: min. 627 points
- TOEFL ITP Level 1: min. 627 points
- Cambridge First Certificate in English + Grade A (FCE)
- Certificate of Advanced English + Grade in English: Grade B or C (CAE)
- Cambridge English: Business Higher (BEC higher)
- · Cambridge IGCSE: 1st oder 2nd Language on average C1
- Pearson PTE Academic: min. 76 points
- TOEIC: Listening and Reading Test min. 945 points, Speaking Test min. 180 points, Writing Test min. 180 points
- telc C1
- UNIcert III
- · Study in English studies or completed degree with English as the language of instruction
- · proof professional qualification as interpreter/ translator
