### Declaration of Consent

### III. General Information on Data Processing

#### 1. Extent and Purpose of the Processing of Personal Data

This form was developed to be able to trace the contacts of a student, teacher, or examiner at Chemnitz University of Technology in case of an infection with the corona virus without the loss of information. As a participant, you can, in your own interest and on a voluntary basis, enter your contact details (full name, (TUC) e-mail address or telephone number) in this form and hand it in with the exam. Information about the event for the exams held in attendance at Chemnitz University of Technology has already been completed by the examiner or the supervising person on a separate form. The completed forms will be treated as strictly confidential. Until then, the data will be stored protected from access by third parties or possible disclosure. Access or insight is only permitted in the case of a (possible) infection with the corona virus and only by explicitly authorised persons of the University Management. The data may only be passed on to the responsible public health department upon their request for the purpose of tracing chains of infection. In summary, the purpose of collecting, storing and, possibly transmitting the data to the competent authorities (usually the local public health department) is to enable the traceability of infections with the coronavirus SARS-CoV-2 and the disease COVID-19.

#### 2. Legal basis for the processing of personal data

The legal basis for voluntary registration is Art. 6 para. 1 sentence 1 lit. a) DSGVO and Art. 6 para. 1 sentence 1 lit. c) DSGVO in conjunction with § Article 4 para. 1 Regulation of the Saxon State Ministry of Social Affairs and Social Cohesion for protection against the corona virus SARS-CoV-2 and COVID-19 (Saxon Corona Protection Regulation - SächsCoronaSchVO) of 25 June 2020 in conjunction with General Ruling of the Saxon State Ministry for Social Affairs and Social Cohesion of 25 June 2020 (Ref.: 15-5422/22) ordering hygiene requirements to prevent the spread of the corona virus. The SächsCoronaSchVO of 25 June 2020 will expire on 17 July 2020 for the greatest part. This means that from 17 July 2020, the person responsible may no longer collect your data on this basis. The Saxon State Ministry for Social Affairs and Social Cohesion decides on a possible extension of the SächsCoronaSchVO.

#### 3. Storage duration (deleting data - limited retention)

The personal data processed by us are stored in a form which permits identification of the affected persons only for as long as is necessary for the purposes for which they are processed. The data collected will therefore be stored for a period of three weeks after the exam and must then be deleted or destroyed by the person responsible without requiring a separate request on your part (e.g. by means of a shredder at least security level P-4).

#### 4. Recipient of the Personal Data

The processing of personal data is only carried out by the natural/legal persons named below: Examining or supervising persons (in lecture halls and seminar rooms) or laboratory/hall/workshop managers (in laboratories, research halls, workshops, etc.) as well as explicitly authorised persons of the University Management of Chemnitz University of Technology (Diana Schreiterer). The data collected may only be passed on to the responsible health authorities at their request for the purpose of tracing possible infection paths. Personal data will not be passed on to third parties not named here, nor will it be transferred to another EU country or to a third country or international organization.

#### 5. Legal/contractual regulations on the provision of personal data and consequences of nonprovision

We also hereby inform you that the provision of the personal data for the above-mentioned purpose is not required by law or contract or necessary for the conclusion of a contract and that you are not obliged to provide the personal data. Not providing your personal data for the above-mentioned purpose does not have any consequences for you.

### IV. Rights of Affected Persons

If personal data are processed by you, you are an affected person in the sense of the DSGVO, so that you are entitled to the following rights against Chemnitz University of Technology (responsible party): right of information, right of correction, right of deletion, right of limitation of processing, right of information in case of disclosure, right of data transferability, right of objection, right of non-exclusively automated decision. To assert your rights towards Chemnitz University of Technology or in case of further questions regarding data protection, you can contact us at any time.

#### 1. Right of Withdrawal

**You have the right to revoke your declaration of consent under data protection law at any time and without giving reasons. The revocation of consent does not affect the legality of the processing that has taken place on the basis of the consent until the revocation. Withdrawal of consent is as simple as giving consent. In the event of withdrawal, your stored data will be deleted immediately in accordance with data protection regulations.**

#### 2. Right of Appeal to a Supervisory Authority

Without prejudice to any other legal remedy, you have the right to complain to a supervisory authority if you believe that the processing of personal data concerning you is in breach of applicable data protection legislation.
