

Checklist for funding of Open Access publication costs for articles

In the year 2021, Chemnitz University of Technology supports publications of its scientists in Open Access Journals by a Publication Fund.

The subsidies to Article Processing Charges (APCs) are dedicated according to the chronological order of invoice receipt.

Requirements for funding

- You are an adherent of Chemnitz University of Technology and you are responsible for the payment of the publication fees as "Corresponding author" or "Submitting author."
- The article did not derive from a third-party-funded project by which the publication fees could have been taken over.
- The article will be published in a fully Open Access Journal with an assessment procedure for quality assurance listed in the [Directory of Open Access Journals](#) (DOAJ). In the case, that the journal is not listed in the DOAJ, the publisher or the journal has to be a member of the [Open Access Scholarly Publishers Association](#) (OASPA) or the [Committee on Publication Ethics](#) (COPE). - The Open Access activation of articles in journals which generally are due to subscription within a hybrid model is funded exclusively under the condition that those journals are part of a transformation contract with Chemnitz University of Technology considered as in compliance with [Plan-S](#) according to the criteria of the [ESAC-initiative](#).
- The article will be published within an established open license, preferably [CC-BY 4.0](#). The conferment of this license is free of cost.
- The maximum funding amount is limited to 2.000 Euro including all costs including VAT.
- Ten percent of the amount to be funded are borne by the author by own funds.
- By the time of submission to the journal for publication, the script of the article contains the following funding note: "The publication of this article was funded by Chemnitz University of Technology".
- The [notes on the accounting of invoices](#) in the case of publications abroad have to be mandatorily observed. The VAT-number of Chemnitz University of Technology (DE140857609) has to be indicated on the invoice.
