<b>Content and qualification objectives</b>	<p><u>Content:</u></p> <p>In this module, students broaden and expand on their knowledge of selected topics from the areas of culture, society, politics, history and a variety of other aspects of the English-speaking world.</p> <p><u>Qualification objectives:</u></p> <p>After successful completion of the module, students have acquired factual knowledge as well as social and cultural competences that will contribute to a better understanding in an international environment by raising awareness of cultural differences.</p> <p>The completion of the module is based on the language competence level C1 of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR).</p>
<b>Teaching methods</b>	<p>The module teaching method is the exercise course.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Exercise course: Cultural Competence (level C1) (2 teaching units)</li> </ul>
<b>Requirements for participation (recommended knowledge and skills)</b>	<p>English language skills at level C1 or placement test (qualification recommendation)</p> <p>Alternatively: completion of the module English in study and subject specific communication II (level B2) (Englisch in Studien- und Fachkommunikation II (Niveau B2))</p>
<b>Module application</b>	The module is suitable for all degree programs.
<b>Requirements for the award of credit points</b>	Successfully passing the module examination is required for the awarding of credit points.
<b>Module examination</b>	<p>The module examination consists of three assessment components. The students must take the following specific assessment components:</p> <p>Creditable study achievements:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>30-minute presentation on the contents of the module (Examination number: 91209)</li> <li>Essay on the contents of the module (scope: 500 to 800 words, processing period: 2 weeks) (Examination number: 91211)</li> <li>Review on the contents of the module (scope: 350 to 500 characters, processing period: 2 weeks) (Examination number: 91212)</li> </ul> <p>Each study achievement is credited, if it is graded at least "sufficient".</p>
<b>Credits and grades</b>	<p>This module is worth 5 credit points.</p> <p>Section 10 of the Examination Regulations specifies how the assessment components are assessed and how the module grade is calculated.</p> <p>Assessment components:</p> <p>Creditable study achievements:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Presentation on the contents of the module, weighting 2</li> <li>Essay on the contents of the module, weighting 1</li> <li>Review on the contents of the module, weighting 1</li> </ul>
<b>Frequency</b>	The module is offered each semester.
<b>Number of hours</b>	The module requires students to complete a total of 150 study hours (60 contact hours and 90 self-study hours).
